ANTECEDENTES

This event featured distinguished speakers such as Gonca Oğuz Gök and Rahime Süleymanoğlu-Kürüm, with Selcen Öner as the moderator. The discussions focused on gender's role in knowledge production and its implications for

CONTENIDO Y ESTRUCTURA
