Additionally, U4SSC is supported by the 17 other UN Agencies and Programmes, including UNITAR. The United for Smart Sustainable Cities (U4SSC) initiative, established in 2016, supports cities and communities worldwide in leveraging digital technologies to accelerate their transition toward smart, sustainable, and resilient urban futures. Aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals, particularly SDG 11, and the Pact for the Future, U4SSC serves as a global platform to shape inclusive policies, foster innovation, and advance digital transformation for people and the planet.
