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CONTEXTE

The World Economic Forum (WEF)'s "The Future of Jobs Report 2025" projects that 170 million jobs will be created by 2030, while 92 million will be displaced. With the rise of artificial intelligence and rapid advancements in technology, cybersecurity and digital risk have become growing priorities in today's world. As reliance on digital systems expands, so do risks related to data security, privacy, and system vulnerabilities, requiring stronger awareness and response capacities across sectors. In this context, strengthening cybersecurity and digital risk awareness is essential to support secure, reliable, and effective multilateral work.

Information security is no longer solely the responsibility of technical teams. Professionals regularly handle sensitive information and operate across interconnected digital systems. Understanding how organisations manage information risk, and the role each employee plays in reducing it, is therefore becoming essential to protecting operations and maintaining institutional trust.

In line with the Pact for the Future and UN 2.0, this e-workshop *Cybersecurity and Digital Risk Resilience: Protecting Organisations, People and Trust* will help participants understand key cyber risks and how organisations can strengthen governance, resilience, and risk awareness. The workshop will strengthen participants' ability to recognise and respond to digital risks, while supporting secure operations and maintaining institutional trust.

OBJECTIFS DU COURS

This e-workshop *Cybersecurity and Digital Risk Resilience: Protecting Organisations, People and Trust* aims to strengthen participants' understanding of how organisations manage information security and respond to cyber risk. It will help participants recognise how their everyday decisions can either expose or protect organisational information, while preparing them to respond more effectively to emerging threats.

This workshop is one of the micro-credentials offered in UNITAR's [Online Professional Diploma in Skills for the Future and Employability](#), comprising six online workshops: three focused on technical skills and three on human-centred skills.

CONTENU ET STRUCTURE

The e-workshop will be 3 hours long, conducted via the platform Zoom and will be facilitated by an expert on the topic. The material presented in the e-workshop will be interactive and assignments will be given for participants to further advance their knowledge.

Upon successful completion of the e-workshop, participants will be eligible to receive a certificate after successful completion.

MÉTHODOLOGIE
