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The World Economic Forum (WEF)'s "The Future of Jobs Report 2025" projects that 170 million jobs will be created by 2030, while 92 million will be displaced. As artificial intelligence becomes increasingly embedded in professional environments, practitioners in multilateral contexts need to understand not only

how these technologies can support their work, but also how they should be governed and used responsibly.

In line with the Pact for the Future and UN 2.0, this e-workshop examines how AI and digital technologies are reshaping institutions and governance. It will help participants understand the opportunities these technologies create alongside key governance considerations. The workshop will strengthen participants' ability to engage confidently with AI-related governance questions in a rapidly changing digital landscape.



This workshop aims to strengthen participants' capacity to understand how AI and digital technologies are transforming institutions and how they can be governed responsibly. By examining both their professional applications and wider governance implications, participants will be better equipped to make informed decisions and remain effective in an evolving workplace.

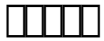

- Identify appropriate ways in which selected AI and digital tools could support research and programme-related work;
- Reflect on how AI and digital tools could be integrated responsibly into their professional practice;
- Recognise key governance challenges associated with AI.



The e-workshop will be 3 hours long, conducted via the platform Zoom and will be facilitated by an expert on the topic. The material presented in the e-workshop will be interactive and assignments will be given for participants to further advance their knowledge.

Upon successful completion of the e-workshop, participants will be eligible to receive a certificate after successful completion.
